Dear Jane,

Thank you for your email of 09 March regarding free public transport for asylum seekers and refugees.

The actions taken by the UK Government have left us with a series of difficult decisions to make as we balance the budget for the next financial year. Against this backdrop, the Welcome Ticket, which provides refugees with free bus travel, has been extended for a further three months and will be reviewed within this period to determine future funding support.

Focusing on a longer-term solution, over the last few months my officials have been working closely with Transport for Wales (TfW) to examine the costs and benefits of extending the Welcome Ticket, including consideration of the inclusion of asylum seekers as an eligible cohort. We are also discussing the introduction of a range of fares and ticketing options designed to make bus travel easier and more accessible for all in the community.

The Welsh Government and TfW will continue to work closely with the bus industry to deliver public transport services within available funds and reduce any impact on bus passengers from any reduction in funding.
