Decisions about the allocation of a holiday stay are made by the Holiday stay group and their decision is final.

Bus fares and a small sum of money to cover additional expenses will be given on arrival.

You will be met on arrival by volunteers who will take you to the cottage where you will meet the owner who will show you round and tell you about the area.

You will be given phone numbers that you can ring if there are any problems during your stay.

There may be people who can call to see you during your stay if you want. It is your holiday so you can decide.

In return for a free holiday you will need to ensure that the cottage is left in a clean and tidy state. Please strip the beds before leaving to help the owner prepare for the next stay.

I understand that this application does not mean that I will be given a holiday but if I am then I agree to look after the cottage and leave it clean and tidy.
